



Let's ride safely



- Cyclists and drivers must know and be aware of all the regulations on the road. Traffic rules and traffic signs must be respected.
- Be patient when overtaking a cyclist, due to the speed difference between the vehicle and the bike. The driver must reduce the speed, signal the maneuver and leave 1.5 meters of lateral distance at least.
- To overtake a cyclist, part or all of the opposing lane may be used, even if there is a continuous line, but only when there is enough visibility and there is no vehicle coming the opposite way.
- If there is not enough place to overtake, stay behind the cyclist or cycling group. Never use the horn. Remember that it can only be used to avoid accidents.
- It's very important to signal changes of direction or other maneuvers for both motorized vehicles and cyclists.
- The law allows cyclists to ride parallel to each other in lines of two people, so drivers must respect these regulations. And cyclists should take into account that on roads with difficult circulation or low visibility it is better to circulate one by one and make it easy for cars to overtake.
- The cyclists should ride on the shoulder or as far to the right as possible. But drivers should keep in mind that often the conditions of the shoulder, the terrain or other obstacles, often makes it impossible for bikes to ride on it.
- When joining crossroads or roundabouts, cyclists have priority of passage when the first cyclist enters. In a roundabout or crossroads, a group of cyclists is considered as a single set. The first cyclist in the group is the one who generates the priority of passage to other vehicles.
- The visibility of the cyclists is very important, so using rear and front lights is essential, as well as wearing striking and visible clothes.
- Alcohol and drugs are forbidden for cyclists and drivers of mechanical traction vehicles. Remember the rate is 0.5 gl / l of blood or 0.25 mg / l of exhaled air. However, when riding or driving, it's always better to keep it at 0.00
